In addition, it contains 58 exercises that familiarize young people with various human rights topics (citizenship and participation, gender, globalization, media, migration, discrimination ...) and encourage them to put what they have learned into practice. Teachers or trainers are familiarized with the most important instruments and actors in human rights protection as well as with central human rights documents.
